## About Laumeier

It is Laumeier's mission to initiate a life-long process of cultural awareness, enrich lives, and encourage creative thinking by actively engaging people in experiences of sculpture and nature simultaneously.

Laumeier Sculpture Park is a unique 105-acre open-air museum with an outdoor sculpture collection, an indoor museum gallery, an amphitheater and hiking trails punctuated with works of art.

## Program Locations

Laumeier's fall and winter programs are offered at two sites. The primary site is Laumeier | ArtSpace at Crestwood Court. All programs take place at Laumeier | ArtSpace unless otherwise noted. All wheel throwing classes will meet at the Education Center at Laumeier Sculpture Park.

## Laumeier | ArtSpace at Crestwood Court

Classes and workshops held at our satellite location - Laumeier | ArtSpace are at 201 Crestwood Court inside the former Crestwood Plaza Mall. Located 2.5 miles east of Laumeier Sculpture Park on Watson Road, Laumeier | ArtSpace is most easily accessed via the east mall entrance next to Chevy's Restaurant. ArtSpace is a collection of artists and cultural organizations offering a variety of programs within Crestwood Court.

## Laumeier Sculpture Park

Classes and workshops held at Laumeier's Education Center are accessible via the Park's north entrance (Geyer and Rott Roads at 12580 Rott Road). Please park in any of the parking lots nearby and walk to the lower level of the Education Center (southeast corner) and enter via the Education Center Deck.

Our age-appropriate six-week courses, taught by experienced artist-instructors, develop technical skills, build confidence and encourage creativity. Small class sizes allow instructors to provide students individual attention and projects are open-ended, allowing participants the freedom to explore their own potential and nurture their self-esteem.

## Laumeiersculpturepark

Laumeier Sculpture Park is a 105-acre park with an outdoor collection of over 80 sculptures. It is available to the public year-round, and many works represent current or unique approaches to art in a natural environment. Laumeier's objective is to expand public awareness of sculpture and provide descriptive evidence to the achievements of contemporary artists.

### EDUCATION DEPARTMENT MISSION

Laumeier Sculpture Park's Education Department believes students expand their critical and creative thinking skills by exploring contemporary art. By interacting with the Park's diverse collection, students will acquire knowledge and understanding of a full range of disciplines and media to clearly and effectively express themselves.

### CLASSROOM & SCHOOL PROGRAMS

#### Park Tours – Laumeier Sculpture Park

Docent-guided walking tours are designed to engage students in dialogue as they view contemporary sculpture, helping them to explore, observe, question and understand the artistic process. Tours can be tailored to meet specific curriculum and group needs. Tours must be reserved at least three weeks in advance. Cost: \$2 per person or \$25 for groups of 12 or fewer. Program length: 45 minutes to an hour; maximum number of students: 175.

#### A Taste of ArtSpace Field Trips – Laumeier | ArtSpace

ArtSpace is a visual and performing arts collective at Crestwood Court offering art and cultural programming to the community. A Taste of ArtSpace field trip provides multiple experiences with working visual and performing artists. For more information on scheduling a field trip to ArtSpace and available programs, call 314-821-1209.

**Outreach Programs** form partnerships with schools to provide classroom visits, curriculum development, and expand awareness and appreciation of the visual arts.

### CLASSROOM VISITS

Classroom visits are conducted by a Museum Educator using a slide or PowerPoint presentation. Materials designed for educators to use before and after a museum visit contain information about selected artists for writing activities, art projects and discussion. All materials support the Missouri Grade-Level Expectations. The cost of each program is \$75.

All programs must be reserved a minimum of three weeks in advance. Additional mileage costs will be charged if school distance is more than 30 miles roundtrip from Laumeier.

### EDUCATOR PROGRAMS

Educator workshops and teacher resources highlight the permanent collection, special exhibits and the visual arts. Educator workshops may be conducted at your facility throughout the school year to help instructors incorporate the permanent collection of Laumeier Sculpture Park into their curriculum. Activities are designed to provide new tools for classroom learning and enhance the visual arts through an interdisciplinary approach. Please contact the Education Department for more information.

The Resource Center provides educators and others with access to a variety of materials on the Park, its exhibitions, and collection. Teaching materials, activity kits, videos, books and posters are available for loan, as well as CDs and DVDs offering an overview of the park and the collection. # Classroom & Community Programs

## COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

Community programming is designed to expand public awareness of sculpture, provide descriptive evidence to the achievements of contemporary artists and encourage life-long learning through the arts.

### Park Tours

- Docent-guided walking tours for groups are available at a cost of \$2 per person or \$25 for groups of 12 or fewer and must be reserved at least three weeks in advance. Tours are designed to be interesting and understandable to the widest possible audience and can be tailored to meet specific group needs.
- Free public tours leave from outside the Laumeier Museum Shop on the first and third Sunday at 2:00 p.m., May through October. Please call to reserve space for groups of 10 or more.
- Docent-led golf cart tours are available at a cost of \$125 per group, up to five individuals, and last approximately one hour. Golf cart tours must be reserved at least three weeks in advance and may be tailored to fit specific group needs and interests.

### Audio Tours

Individuals may check out i-Pod audio players from the Museum Shop and take a self-guided tour while hearing about more than 20 sculptures in the collection. \$5 per person

### Community Presentations

Presentations on the history of Laumeier, current exhibitions and the permanent collection are available to community groups and topics may be tailored to specific group interest. \$125 per presentation

### Art Camps, Studio Classes and Workshops

Laumeier Sculpture Park offers a variety of camps, art studio classes and workshops year-round, for all ages. Program brochures are available in February and August.

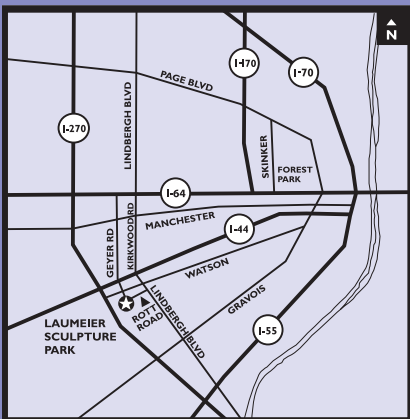
