Laumeier's spring and summer programs are offered at two sites. The primary site is Laumeier Sculpture Park.

Laumeier Sculpture Park

Camps, classes and workshops held at Laumeier's Education Center are accessible via the Park's north entrance (Geyer and Rott Roads at 12580 Rott Road). Programs held at the Laumeier Shelters are accessible via the Park's west entrance (.25 mile southwest of Geyer and Rott Roads at 9050 Rott Road). Follow the driveway to the South Parking Lot and walk the paved path to the Laumeier Shelters. Program listings for sessions that take place at Laumeier are listed as:

Laumeier | ArtSpace at Crestwood Court

Classes and workshops held at Laumeier | ArtSpace, our satellite location, located at 201 Crestwood Court inside the former Crestwood Plaza Mall. Located 2.5 miles east of Laumeier Sculpture Park on Watson Road, Laumeier | ArtSpace is most easily accessed via the east mall entrance nearest the Post Office. ArtSpace is a collection of artists and cultural organizations offering a variety of programs within Crestwood Court. Classroom & Community Programs

Laumeier Sculpture Park is a 105-acre park with an outdoor collection of more than 75 sculptures. It is available to the public year-round, and many works represent current or unique approaches to art in a natural environment. Laumeier's objective is to expand public awareness of sculpture and provide descriptive evidence to the achievements of contemporary artists.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT MISSION

Laumeier Sculpture Park's Education Department believes students expand their critical and creative thinking skills by exploring contemporary art. By interacting with the Park's diverse collection, students will acquire knowledge and understanding of a full range of disciplines and media to clearly and effectively express themselves.

CLASSROOM & SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Park Tours – Laumeier Sculpture Park

Docent-guided walking tours are designed to engage students in dialogue as they view contemporary sculpture, helping them to explore, observe, question and understand the artistic process. Tours can be tailored to meet specific curriculum and group needs. Tours must be reserved at least three weeks in advance. Cost: \$2 per person or \$25 for groups of 12 or fewer. Program length: 45 minutes to an hour; maximum number of students: 175.

Outreach Programs form partnerships with schools to provide classroom visits, curriculum development, and expand awareness and appreciation of the visual arts.

CLASSROOM VISITS

Classroom visits are conducted by a Museum Educator using a slide or PowerPoint presentation. Materials designed for educators to use before and after a museum visit contain information about selected artists for writing activities, art projects and discussion. All materials support the Missouri Grade-Level Expectations. The cost of each program is \$75. All programs must be reserved a minimum of three weeks in advance. Additional mileage costs will be charged if school distance is more than 30 miles roundtrip from Laumeier.

EDUCATOR PROGRAMS

Educator workshops and teacher resources highlight the permanent collection, special exhibits and the visual arts. Educator workshops may be conducted at your facility throughout the school year to help instructors incorporate the permanent collection of Laumeier Sculpture Park into their curriculum. Activities are designed to provide new tools for classroom learning and enhance the visual arts through an interdisciplinary approach. Please contact the Education Department for more information.

The Resource Center provides educators and others with access to a variety of materials on the Park, its exhibitions, and collection. Teaching materials, activity kits, videos, books and posters are available for loan, as well as CDs and DVDs offering an overview of the park and the collection. Classroom & Community Programs

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

Community programming is designed to expand public awareness of sculpture, provide descriptive evidence to the achievements of contemporary artists and encourage life-long learning through the arts.

Laumeier Free Family Days

Families with children of all ages are invited to attend Laumeier's Free Family Days – with hands-on activities to spark the imagination and inspire creativity. The days are themed around special exhibitions or inspired by the sculptures at Laumeier. Detailed information on this program can be found on page 14.

Park Tours

- Docent-guided walking tours for groups are available at a cost of \$2 per person or \$25 for groups of 12 or fewer and must be reserved at least three weeks in advance. Tours are designed to be interesting and understandable to the widest possible audience and can be tailored to meet specific group needs.
- Free public tours leave from outside the Laumeier Museum Shop on the first and third Sunday at 2:00 p.m., May through October. Please call to reserve space for groups of 10 or more.
- Docent-led golf cart tours are available at a cost of \$125 per group, up to five individuals, and last approximately one hour. Golf cart tours must be reserved at least three weeks in advance and may be tailored to fit specific group needs and interests.

Audio Tours

Individuals may check out i-Pod audio players from the Museum Shop and take a self-guided tour while learning about more than 20 sculptures in the collection (\$5 per person).

Community Presentations

Presentations on the history of Laumeier, current exhibitions and the permanent collection are available to community groups and topics may be tailored to specific group interest (\$125 per presentation).

Park: 8:00 a.m. until 1/2 hour past sunset, closed Christmas Day

Museum: Tuesdays - Fridays, 10:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.; Saturdays and Sundays, 12:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. Closed Mondays and most legal holidays.

Admission to the Park and Museum is free. There are nominal admission charges for some special events.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration

Early registration is strongly recommended, as it helps to determine whether or not a class or workshop will be offered. The registration deadline is seven (7) working days before classes are scheduled to begin. Classes may be cancelled due to low enrollment if the class minimum is not met by the deadline. If a class has been secured, registrations will be accepted until two (2) working days before classes begin. A confirmation will not be sent for registrations received less than one week prior to the beginning of class.

Confirmation

Camp, class and workshop confirmations will be sent as quickly as possible but please allow two weeks for processing.

Refunds, Withdrawals and Cancellations

Written notice of withdrawal must be received three weeks prior to the start of each session in order to receive a full refund, less the cancellation fee of \$15. No refunds or credits will be issued less than three weeks before each session. Failure to attend or verbal notification does not constitute an official withdrawal. Membership contributions are non-refundable. Laumeier reserves the right to cancel, reschedule, or combine classes when necessary. If a minimum enrollment is not met, sessions may be canceled and students will be notified in advance and a full refund will be made.

Missed Classes

Laumeier Sculpture Park does not arrange make-up sessions for classes missed by students. If Laumeier finds it necessary to cancel a class meeting due to unforeseen circumstances, a make-up class that is convenient to the majority of the participants will be arranged.

Art Camp

SUMMER ART CAMP

Join us for our popular summer art camp, which offers several one-week sessions throughout the summer, from June 7 through July 30. Students of all ages will learn how to use a variety of media and experience activities including ceramics, sculpture, painting, drawing, printmaking and textile arts. They will develop cultural appreciation and aesthetic awareness as they find inspiration in the museum's collections.

Our emphasis is on interactive, fun learning with exposure to a wide range of artistic media and methods. Your child will gain a greater appreciation and understanding of art, as well as developing his or her own talent for self-expression. Camps are led by local, experienced art instructors and supported by caring staff. Each camp session includes a variety of two and three-dimensional, age-appropriate projects. Themes enhance camper motivation and identify artists, movements, media and techniques for each session. Different projects are developed for each session so those registering for multiple weeks receive a broader experience. All materials will be provided and campers will receive a camp t-shirt.

Camps for ages 4 to 6

Eight, one-week, half-day sessions are available for ages 4 to 6; camp hours are from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. In addition to age appropriate projects, camp includes storytelling, games and snack time. Themes enhance camper motivation and identify artists, movements, media and techniques for each session. Each counselor develops age-appropriate projects and activities in a variety of media for their group, related to the themes.

GO FOR A WALK WITH A LINE: June 7–11

Everything begins with a line. Fuzzy or controlled, meandering or spiraling, a line may define a space, create movement, or the illusion of volume. It may be two-dimensional as in a drawing or painting, or three-dimensional, as with wire. Join us as we go for a walk with a line—the most expressive element of art.

IT'S ALL ABOUT ME: June 14–18

Reveal yourself through your art! Create works of art that reflect your personality and creative nature through sculpture and works on paper.

PASSPORT TO ART: June 21–25

Craft personalized artforms inspired by the traditional and non-traditional art of other cultures.

LIGHT IMPRESSIONS & SELF EXPRESSIONS: June 28–July 2

Capture a fleeting moment like an Impressionist and express your feelings and ideas as you delve into art of the 20th Century.

COMPLIMENTARY COMPLEMENTS: July 6–9 (no camp July 5)

Ponder the phenomenon of COLOR. Explore how color affects your feelings and how you view objects. Learn to use color as a tool while creating artworks in a variety of media.

ARTSCAPE: July 12–16

Discover the many ways in which artists depict their chosen subject matter. Landscapes, seascapes, cityscapes – what is your “scape”? Explore the works of past artists as you create your own artscape.

NATURAL REACTIONS: July 19–23

Unearth your creativity while encountering the mysteries of art and nature. View the work of artists inspired by the world around them and create your own works in and of the natural world.

ART TODAY: BLURRING THE BOUNDARIES: July 26–30

Discover the art of today. Explore the ways in which art is used to communicate ideas and feelings as it departs from tradition.

Registration

Registrations are processed in the order they are received. Confirmation of camp registration is your receipt of the Parent Packet. Please allow two weeks for processing. Parents will be contacted immediately if the session registered for is full.

Changes & Withdrawals

Written notice of withdrawal must be received three weeks prior to the start of each session in order to receive a full refund, less the cancellation fee of \$15. No refunds or credits will be issued less than three weeks before each session unless a documented reason is presented. Art Camp session changes are accepted up to three weeks prior to the start of a session with a \$15.00 processing fee.

Extended day

Extended day is available for 6-15 year-old (400-level) camp sessions only. Morning sessions are available from 7-9 a.m. Afternoon sessions are available from 3-6 p.m. The form for extended day is included with the Parent Packet (mailed to you upon registration) and should be returned with payment at least two weeks before a session begins. Parents do not have to pay for more than one week of extended day at a time. Late requests are granted on a space available basis. Costs for each extended day are \$5 for each morning session; \$7.50 for each afternoon session. Charges are not prorated. Membership discount does not apply to extended day fees.

Friday, February 5 **Mark Newport: *Self-Made Man***, an exhibition that explores the role of modern man and modern-day heroes. Opening February 5 and continuing through May 9, 2010, Newport's human-scale, hand-knit superhero costumes, photographs, video and embroidered comic book covers will be shown in the Park's indoor galleries. The artist will perform "in character" at the February 5 opening reception and will also present a gallery talk on Saturday, April 3 as well as participate in the Knit-In @ the Park special event the same afternoon.

Mark Newport is a man who knits like no other. The Michigan-based artist creates human-scale, acrylic-knit superhero costumes that question the role of heroes in contemporary culture. Some of these costumes reflect the comic book legends that many of us grew up with. Newport also expands on the genre with creations of his own. Batman and Captain America are presented on equal terms with Newport's Sweaterman and Y-Man. The costumes present a great tension as they probe the unquestioned iconic status of the mythological superheroes and the obvious shortcomings of the knit suit to protect anyone who might choose to don it. Protection of self, family and society are all issues on the table.

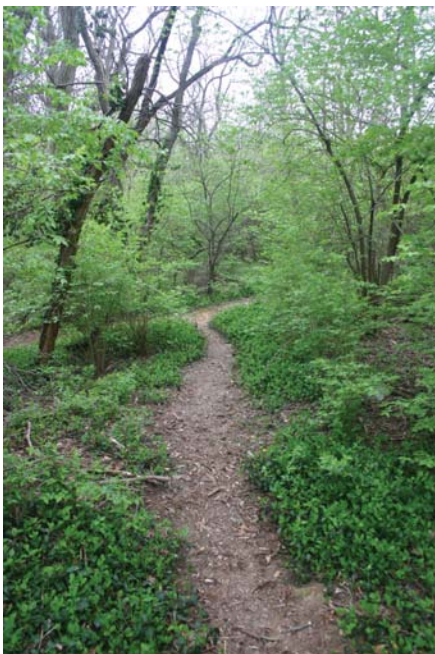

Laumeier Sculpture Park expands the context of contemporary sculpture beyond the traditional confines of a museum. It is Laumeier's mission to initiate a lifelong process of cultural awareness, enrich lives, and encourage creative thinking by actively engaging people in experiences of sculpture and nature simultaneously. The museum boasts a 105-acre campus, which showcases the outdoor collection of over 75 sculptures, available to the public year round. Works of art exhibited throughout the site represent current approaches to sculpture in a natural environment. Laumeier Sculpture Park partners with St. Louis County Parks in the development, operation and preservation of this unique cultural institution.

Brief History

In 1968, Mrs. Matilda Laumeier bequeathed the first 72 acres of the future Laumeier Sculpture Park, together with a large story-and-a-half house of cut stone, to the people of St. Louis County in memory of her husband, Henry H. Laumeier, for the benefit of the greater St. Louis metropolitan area. In 1975, the recently opened County Park was proposed as a possible site for the exhibition of sculpture and the concept of today's Laumeier emerged. Laumeier Sculpture Park first opened to the public in 1976. Catapulted by a collaborative group of citizen leaders in the arts, education and business communities, Laumeier Sculpture Park, 501(c)(3), was incorporated in September 1977. Laumeier Sculpture Park today has over 300,000 visitors annually.



Accredited by the American Association of Museums, Laumeier Sculpture Park is an institution of international significance. The Park is one of a handful of open-air museums around the world and a unique compliment to the cultural landscape of the St. Louis region. Laumeier provides high-quality learning experiences for the greater St. Louis community and for visitors from all over the world. The many changing exhibitions, concerts, educational programs, lectures and special events developed at Laumeier Sculpture Park for all to enjoy support the mission of the museum.

Admission to Laumeier Sculpture Park is free. There are nominal admission charges for some special events.

Special Events

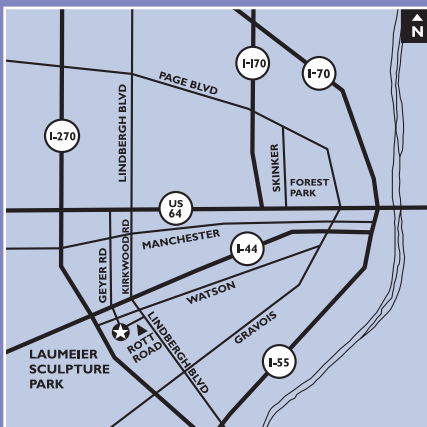
