NEW THIS YEAR

About Laumeier

Laumeier Sculpture Park is a living laboratory where artists and audiences explore the relationship between contemporary art and the natural environment. Founded in 1976, Laumeier is one of the first and largest dedicated sculpture parks in the country, making it an institution of international significance as well as a unique complement to the cultural landscape of the St. Louis region. Laumeier is a nonprofit, accredited art museum that operates in partnership with St. Louis County Parks. Laumeier presents 60 artworks in a 105-acre park available free to the public year-round, and serves 300,000 patrons annually through temporary exhibitions, education programs, public events and sculpture conservation.

Park Hours + Admission

Laumeier is open daily from 8:00 a.m.–30 minutes past sunset. The Adam Aronson Fine Arts Center is open Wednesday–Sunday from 10:00 a.m.–5:00 p.m. The Park is free and open to the public year-round, with the exception of special events. Laumeier is closed to the public the Thursday–Sunday of Art Fair weekend in May, Harvest Festival Sunday in October and Christmas Day.

Directions

Laumeier is located near I-270 and I-44, 16 miles and 20 minutes from the Gateway Arch. From I-44 Eastbound or Westbound, exit at Lindbergh Boulevard (Exit 277B), drive 0.5 miles south to Rott Road (turn right) and proceed 0.5 miles west to the Park's Main Entrance (on the left).

Program Locations

Programs held in the Kranzberg Education Lab and on the Siteman Carriage House Deck are accessible via the Park's Main Entrance at Geyer and Rott Roads. Programs held at the Education Shelters are accessible via the Park's West Entrance, ¼-mile southwest of Geyer and Rott Roads. Follow the driveway to the South (back) Parking Lot and walk the paved path to the Education Shelters.

Accessibility

Laumeier's public restrooms are wheelchair accessible, as are some pathways. Vehicles are allowed in Laumeier's parking lots only; please do not drive on walking paths. Parks and Recreation programs and facilities are available for people of all abilities. GIGI SCARIA: TIME

April 16–August 14, 2016

Curator: Dana Turkovic, Curator of Exhibitions

Laumeier presents new work by New Delhi-based artist Gigi Scaria, whose exhibition *Time* focuses on “social mapping”—whether territorial, cultural, environmental or of the hierarchies and systems of our global communities. Scaria’s project is part of *New Territories: BRICS*, Laumeier’s five-year focus on artists from around the globe, and will consist of site-specific works inspired by the constant building flux in New Delhi and the ancient ruins of Cahokia Mounds. *Time* includes recent photographs, films and sculptures inside the Adam Aronson Fine Arts Center, as well as a monumental “totem” of cast scale models of old Delhi domestic architecture in Laumeier’s Outdoor Galleries.

Scaria’s practice focuses on hurried transformation of cityscapes—more specifically, the sprawl of New Delhi and the chaotic demolition and displacement throughout impoverished areas. With a layer of satire and cynicism, his abstracted structures—both imagined and constructed—explore the themes and experience of “time” in analyzing urban architecture and investigating the past, present and future of his locale and the permanence and impermanence of personal and social space.

Laumeier Docents provide tours of the Park grounds, actively involving visitors in conversations about contemporary art. These vibrant volunteers help interpret the artworks for visitors of different ages with various backgrounds and interests from across the region. Following the completion of an in-depth training course (offered twice per year), Laumeier Docents are expected to pay annual dues (\$50), attend month meetings and provide six tours annually. Laumeier Docents must be ages 18 and up.

ART CLASSES + WORKSHOPS

Age-appropriate art courses are offered as either multi-day classes or one-day workshops. Art Classes and Workshops provide participants with a focused experience within a particular medium, process or concept. Participants work at their own level and pace with guided instruction for skill improvement.

Art Classes and Workshops are taught by local, experienced Artist-Instructors and are designed to encourage artistic development and self-expression. Small class sizes provide participants with individual attention; projects are designed to allow participants the freedom to explore their own potential and creativity.

Laumeier's education programs span many media, including clay, drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and textiles. Materials are always provided!

Assistance is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis and cannot be guaranteed for all applicants. Scholarships are granted solely on the basis of financial need and are awarded on a sliding scale for 25%, 50%, 75% or 100% of the program cost. Assistance is granted regardless of race, gender, religion, disability, sexual orientation or nationality. Applicants are encouraged to submit their completed Scholarship Application Form and Registration Form by Friday, April 1, 2016; Laumeier cannot guarantee space in a program without a completed Registration Form. 
